Introduction

If you have trees on-site then labelling your trees and other plants, for that matter, will enhance a visitor's or service user's experience.

The Tree Labelling service was born out of a need to provide people with the language to describe the array of plant life around us.

We recognise it is often the most simplest of actions that can make the most difference and tree labelling certainly fits that bill. Our service is not just about the physical tree labelling, but it is also about creating tree spotting resources which can be shared with your visitors or learners. There is nothing more exciting than a bit of clipboard and paper and an old fashioned treasure hunt. The treasure in this case being trees.

When children and adults in playgrounds, parks and streets and gardens can recognise nature's giants among us then we know they are connected to their environment enough to learn their language. Many people can name logos but few can name a tree. This is not right.

We live in the age of information where devices can identify plant names just like that but physicals label always win simply because they are immediately accessible to all.

Just as we all have names; trees deserve theirs too.

Option 1 - End to End Service

We visit the site to identify the species of trees to be labelled. We typically focus on labelling each new species of tree, but if, for example, two oak trees are spread far apart on the site then we will label both. Special consideration is given to notable, veteran, ancient and champion trees.

We also consider the risk and safety aspect of positioning labels on those trees in areas which may pose a hazard risk if someone was to stop and read them. Once we have drawn up a list of tree names on your site, we will create the tree labels using our mobile engraving service.

Costs vary depending on the work but begin at £399 including all materials for option 1 where we attend your site, identify the species of trees and label on-site. Option 2 is for those who know the species of their trees and allows them to order our labels and fittings and attach these themselves.

Yes. However, the labels for plants are affixed to the ground, whereas tree labels are affixed to the trunk.

No. we generally only label one tree of each type on-site to avoid cluttering the environment and to keep the aesthetics of the environment intact. However, if labelling every tree is what you want then that is what we will do.

A long time! Anywhere between 5 to 10 years. The labels and fixings are made of the most durable and UV resistant material, the material used for memorials. We do not use substandard materials as we understand that your investment needs to be cost effective. Furthermore, the text is inscribed as opposed to being painted on or lasered which means it will not fade easily.
